

**ABE LINCOLN IN ILLINOIS****1939 B/W Raymond Massey, Ruth Gordon 110 Min. NR**

A captivating portrayal of Abraham Lincoln and the political scene in the years leading to the fateful 1860 election. The first half of the film, which chronicles Lincoln's early life in Illinois, is not particularly useful; the second half, however, can be effective as background for discussion of the critical events of the 1850's.
